Undergraduate - SDSU - Patrick Hamner

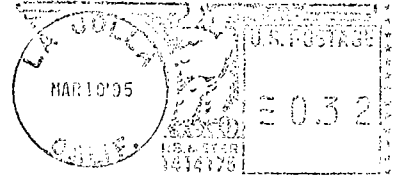
Topic: Quantitative Petrologic Description of the Clasts Represented in the Late Cretaceous Cabrillo Formation at Bird Rock, San Diego.
