SPEAKER:

Dr. David D. Smith. Dr. Smith received his Ph.D from Stanford University and has held positions with the USGS, Louisiana State University, Dartmouth College, University of North Carolina, Ocean Science & Engineering, Dillingham Corporation, Woodward-Clyde Consultants and, since 1972, as president of David Smith & Associates. David has specialized in the environmental and regulatory aspects of coastal facility siting and the disposal of construction waste, particularly dredged spoil.

TOPIC:

"Environmental Geology" Talk will examine some of the basis concepts of environmental geology and its legal and regulatory framework. Examples will include: dredged material disposal for an LNG Terminal in coastal Texas; a wildlife preserve in San Diego Bay; effects of a mine waste spill in Florida; a dredging feasibility analysis for Agua Hedionda Lagoon; and deep-ocean disposal of oil well drilling muds.
