While working on a regional geologic evaluation of an area in Southern Iran, numerous interesting geologic conditions were encountered. The presentation will cover the general geology and some of the interesting geologic conditions encountered, including salt diapirs, mud volcanoes, faults, and landslides. Daryl opened his own practice in 1987 and was recently elected chairman of the SDSU Geology Alumni Association.
