SUMMARY: The "Blob" is a floating hydrocarbon plume that currently occupies approximately six square blocks in the marina district of downtown San Diego. The "Blob" has been scrutinized by approximately 6 consecutive consulting firms hired by a City-owned agency to evaluate the problem. Volume estimates ranged from 90,000 to 450,000 gallons. Notoriety prompted a research paper and limited field study by Hawk and others, and became the focus of this study with Dave Huntley and James Wallace of SDSU. Current work suggests a volume of 64,000 gallons is more likely, based on new methods of analysis, and that hydrocarbon flow and remediation may be different than anticipated. Robert Hawk is an engineering geologist with the City of San Diego, a 1980 graduate of SDSU, and is registered in both engineering geology and civil engineering.


