IN MEMORIAM

MASON LOWELL HILL

Pioneering structural geologist and San Andreas fault expert

Mason Lowell Hill was born in Pomona, California on January 17, 1904, and died in Whittier, California on March 11, 1992. He was born two years before the great San Francisco earthquake. His parents had migrated to California from Missouri, and they settled at the base of the San Gabriel Mountains, 20 miles from the San Andreas fault. This general area of the Los Angeles basin was the California of the rapidly developing petroleum industry in southern center of the rapidly developing petroleum industry in southern California. Hill's life was intertwined with these two geologic influences - the San Andreas fault and the oil industry.

In 1922, when Hill registered for classes at Pomona College, his advisor by chance that first day was A.O. Woodford of the newly formed Geology Department. Woodford convinced Hill he should take geology to satisfy his science requirement. This course convinced Hill to become a geologist.

He was recognized with honorary membership in the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, Pacific Section of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, and the South Coast Geological Society. AAPG presented him with the association's highest award, the Sydney Powers Memorial Medal in 1981. Woodford and Hill were awarded honorary Doctorates of Sciences by Pomona College. SCGS dedicated the 1982 volume 'Geology and Mineral Wealth of the Transverse Ranges' to Hill stating that his was a 'life dedicated to the love of geology, the desire to understand 'geology, and the wish to convey his comprehension to others.'

Hill's avid curiosity, gregarious personality, lust for learning, precision in terminology, streak of iconoclasm, and ability to challenge conventional thought, all made him an invaluable observer and contributor to the present understanding of California's complex geology.

Hill is survived by his wife, Marie, five sons, eleven grandchildren, and one great-grandchild. Contributions can be made to the Mason L. Hill Scholarship at Pomona College, 609 N.
