Topic

ER Mapper and its applications in Geology.

Speakers Andrew Nickerson, Eric Frost, and Geoff Nelson.

Andrew Nickerson is the Vice President and the Regional Manager of the ER Mapper, ERM Americas Region. He will speak on the Company background and the Product background.

Eric Frost, Professor of Geology, San Diego State University, will speak on the Applications of the product at SDSU Geology department.

Geoff Nelson, Mining and Environmental Segment Manager, ER Mapper, will demonstrate the software, and will present a hands-on demonstration for those who are interested.

Abstract

The primary product of the Company, the ER Mapper, is an advanced digital image processing system created to help earth scientists and geologists integrate, enhance, visualize, and interpret their geographic data. In contrast to conventional disk-to-disk image processing products, ER Mapper features a breakthrough that allows truly interactive "real time" integration and processing of data. The point-and-click graphical user interface streamlines complex image processing tasks to provide a fast, flexible "what if" tool for earth scientists in all application areas. ER Mapper is available for DEC, IBM, HP, SGI, Sun, and Windows 95, and NT systems.

The editors require that the rock unit nomenclature, descriptions, locality names, etc., be maintained throughout the volume in a consistent manner as stipulated in the guidelines. All manuscripts should reflect original work which further knowledge in the field. Deadline for camera-ready paper submittals is August 1, 1995.
