Speaker: Dr. Roy J. Shlemon.

Dr. Shlemon is a member of the San Diego Association of Geologists and several other national and international geological organizations. He received the Ph.D. degree from University of California at Berkeley, and formerly was on the faculty of the University of California at Baton Rouge. For the past 25 years, Dr. Shlemon has been consulting in the fields of Quartenary geology, geomorphology and soil stratigraphy. His work is world-wide, and ranges from mining to siting of nuclear power plants and other large engineered structures. Dr. Shlemon just returned from a lecture trip to Barcelona, Spain; in July he will be a featured speaker at the South Africa Section of the Association of Engineering Geologists.

Title: The Geologist: Discovery of Ancient Civilizations, Colombia, South America.

Abstract: Over a 50 years ago, placer mining geologists in northern Colombia observed an intricate pattern of 2-3 km long "ridges" within and adjacent to meandering river channels in the tropical rainforest. These features were similar to extensive tailing fields laid down by bucket-line gold dredges, assumed to be during the early part of this century. However, in the 1960's, Professor James J. Parsons, a geographer at the University of California at Berkeley, based on aerial photograph interpretation, identified these features to be a segment of the thousands of hectares of "ridged fields" in Colombia and Equador. The ridges (camellones) ultimately proved to be earthworks constructed by a pre-Colombia civilization(s). Radiocarbon (MRT) dates from inter-mound buried organic horizons indicate that ridged fields were abandoned prior to about 4000 years ago. But who were the ancient constructors of the ridged fields? When were the ridges and mounds built? What was the purpose of the construction: for agriculture; for religious purposes? What social structure enabled this hydraulic civilization to carry out such massive earth-moving? And what caused the demise of the civilization? Equally enigmatic is the total extent of the fields, for it is likely that additional thousands of fields are no longer visible, now covered by an increasing thickness of sediment stemming from modern deforestation, agriculture and mining.
