Program:

Downtown Faulting

Abstract

Recent trenching investigations in downtown San Diego have continued to expand the knowledge of fault locations and Holocene activity within the Rose Canyon fault zone. In the offshore areas within and near San Diego Bay, new geologic information from seismic reflection surveys is updating the picture of local faults. This talk will review some previous trenching studies within the Downtown Graben, and will also present findings from recent fault investigations at other areas in and around downtown.

David Schug is Director of E. __neering Geology and has been with Wood. ard-Clyde in San Diego since 1979. He received his BS and MS degrees from San Diego State University (SDSU). Over the past several years, Dave has managed geologic and geotechnical investigations for the South Bay Ocean Outfall, the Point Loma Outfall Extension, and the proposed LRT trolley tunnels at SDSU. He has investigated active faults in downtown San Diego and offshore areas.

1997 Treasurer's Report:

As of January 8, 1998, SDAG has a total cash reserve of approximately \$5,000. At this time last year, cash reserves stood at approximately \$11,000. This decline is a result of several factors, including: Increased field trip expenses in 1997; Reprint expenses for the Anza-Borrego Field Guide (sales of this guidebook through the Borrego Springs Visitor Center and other outlets will offset this expense through 1998); SDAG Scholarship funds; and Substantial year-end contributions to the San Diego Natural History Museum and the Gordon Gastil Endowed Scholarship Fund at SDSU. All things considered, SDAG is in a healthy and stable financial situation at this time.

1998 SDAG FIELD TRIP and CALL FOR PAPERS:

Tentative plans have been made for the annual field trip and associated publication entitled "Geothermal Resources and Geological Features of the Imperial and Mexicali Valleys". Field trip dates are the three-day weekend of October 10-12, 1998. Proposed sites on the itinerary include geothermal power facilities on both sides of the border, faults and other tectonic features characteristic of the Salton Trough and Colorado River delta, and the Cerro Prieto volcano. Saturday night and optional Sunday night camp will be southwest of Laguna Salada in palm-studded Guadalupe Canyon. This site offers natural hot tubs within the Sierra Juarez fault zone, reminiscent of a combination of Borrego Palm Canyon and Agua Caliente Hot Springs.
