1998 GEOLOGY GUIDEBOOK and CALL FOR PAPERS:

The 1998 SDAG volume, associated with the annual field trip, is Geology and Geothermal Resources of the Southern Colorado Desert (Salton Trough): southeastern Alta California, northeastern Baja California. Field trip dates are the three-day weekend of October 10-12, 1998. Tentative itinerary includes geothermal facilities on both sides of the border, faults and other features characteristic of the Salton Trough and Colorado River delta, the Cerro Prieto volcano, and Guadalupe Canyon thermal zone.

Earth science papers, related to any aspects of the above areas or topics, are now being accepted. Guidebook format will be similar to the 1997 SDAG volume Santa Cruz Island: Geology Field Trip Guide: 6"x9", color cover, b&w interior photos, illustrations (maps, diagrams, graphs, artwork). Text and tables should be saved onto 3.5" disk in flat ASCII or PLAIN TEXT with an exact hard copy included. We will format the text to fit the volume. Illustrations should be print quality and cameraready hard copy, keeping in mind that they will be sized to fit the 6x9 page (maps may be printed full-bleed [no margin] if necessary for scale or detail). Photos may be b&w, color print, or slides.

Deadlines are:

- May 30 Abstract (one paragraph summary of paper) with additional notes on photos and illustrations that will be forthcoming.
- June 30 Final text and tables on disk and hard copy. Preliminary versions of illustrations.
- July 30 Final camera-ready copy of illustrations and photos.

We recommend the following: Chicago Manual of Style, 14th edition (general); and USGS Suggestions to Authors, 7th edition (earth sciences). Please contact Lowell Lindsay for questions or comments (see cover page for contact information).

IN MEMORIAM:

Richard Merriam: 1913 - 1998

Dr. Richard Merriam, eminent Southern California geologist, died on April 2 of complications of Lou Gehrig's disease (ALS). He is survived by a daughter, Martha Merriam, a son, Robert Merriam, and three grandchildren.

Dr. Merriam died in La Mesita, the same ranch house, near what is now San Marcos, where he was born 85 years ago. The land homesteaded by his grandfather in the 1870's was named by him Twin Oaks Valley, for two majestic oak trees on the property below the Merriam Mountains.

Richard Merriam attended Twin Oaks Valley Elementary School and later Escondido High School. He obtained his degree in geology from Pomona College in 1934, and later earned a doctorate at the University of California at Berkeley in 1940. His dissertation focused on granitic rocks of north San Diego County.

Prior to World War II, Dr. Merriam was employed by the U.S. Geological Survey. During the war, he played a significant role in the installation of an aqueduct to provide imported water to military facilities in the San Diego area. For the next 30 years, he was a professor of geology at the University of Southern California, from which he retired in 1979. He continued active private geological consulting until about three years ago, when he was finally disabled by ALS.

Among other things, Dr. Merriam will be remembered for preparing some of the first geologic maps of North County. Truly a pioneer, from a family of pioneers.

Jim Kozakowski: 1946 - 1998

Jim Kozakowski, an integral member of our geologic community, passed away on April 30, 1998. He suffered a stroke and passed away at the age of 52. Jim was married to Anna, and they have two daughters.

At the time of his death, he worked for Bechtel National, Inc., on the Navy CLEAN II project as a contract task order leader from its inception. Most of his work was performed at Naval Air Station, North Island.

Jim lived in the State of Utah for 10 to 15 years prior to coming to California. He was engaged in mineral exploration during this time. He decided to come to California in part because he was impressed by the rigorous geologic licensing required by the State of California. Once in California, Jim worked at Law/Crandall for approximately 4 years prior to joining Bechtel. He was initially based in San Diego and was later transferred to Sacramento to conduct an environmental investigation at Beale Air Force Base.


Jim was a great person to work with. He had a wealth of experience and intellect to make quick decisions on performing all phases of environmental work. If he did not have a solution to the job he would always find someone who could provide input.

He was an avid saltwater fisherman, organizing many fishing trips for yellowtail and yellowfin. A recent trip, which Jim planned for almost a year, was to one of the grey whale breeding lagoons in Baja Califoria, Mexico. The trip was a huge success and fun was had by all involved.

Jim was a member of the San Diego Assocation of Geologists and attended meetings several times a year. He obtained registration as a geologist and certification as an engineering geologist in the State of California.

Jim will be missed, but those of us who knew and worked with him have wonderful memories!
