Speaker: Eric Riggs, Department of Earth Sciences, University of California, Riverside

Program: Indigenous Earth Sciences Project (IESP): Exploring Geoscience Education in

Southern California Native American Communities

The geoscience community has long been active in efforts to improve public science literacy and to publicize the relevance of our scientific work to people's daily lives. Organizations and journals are dedicated to improving geoscience education in the classroom at many different levels, including outreach programs designed to increase ethnic minority participation in the earth sciences. The Indigenous Earth Sciences Project (IESP) at the

University of California, Riverside (UCR) is such a program founded with support from the National Science Foundation (NSF), with the goal of increasing Native American participation in all aspects of the earth sciences.

The number of minority students enrolled in all science programs nationwide, geosciences included, is disproportionately low relative to population. This is especially true for Native students, for economic, cultural, and historical reasons that will be discussed in the presentation. However, the earth sciences may offer a lower set of cultural and social barriers to entry into the sciences for Native students.

The IESP will address these issues by holding three conferences this Spring at UCR to encourage direct communication between geoscientists and Native Californians. These conferences will explore: perceptions of Southern California geology and geologic history, in an effort to identify possible cultural barriers; approaches to classroom and field earth science teaching in Native communities, including what has worked well in other Native communities in North America; and a discussion of these issues by geologists working on or near Native lands with the Native people from those areas. Future efforts may include field trips and direct involvement with geoscience education at all levels in Southern California Native communities.

Eric M. Riggs holds a BA in English Literature from Pomona College and is currently a Ph.D. candidate in Geological Sciences at the University of California, Riverside. He has taught courses in Geology and Critical Thinking at Pasadena City College. With interests in both the humanities and sciences, he studies the role of science in our society. At UC Riverside he studies shear failure phenomena and source physics of deep earthquakes and transformation-induced faulting. Related work includes fractal properties and non-linear scaling phenomena generated by shear failure propagation in the laboratory.
