SUMMARY:

THE STATUS OF THE CONSTRUCTION AGGREGATES INDUSTRY IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY

The aggregate industry is comprised of the extraction of sand, gravel and stone and supports virtually all types of construction projects. Because aggregate is a high bulk, low value commodity, these natural resources tend to serve local markets. Transportation costs significantly affect the final price of aggregate. While demand for aggregate rises within the County, no new production sites have been permitted in the past 30 years. Due to expiration of permitting terms for active production sites and the cost of acquiring entitlement to expanded operational areas, the number of active production sites in the County has dwindled from 45 sites in 1980 to 14 active sites today.

The presentation will cover the historic, current, and projected status of aggregate consumption and production in San Diego County including data from the California Division of Mines and Geology, SANDAG, and the California Department of Finance. Also highlighted in the presentation are the permitting terms for existing production sites in the County as well as the requirements for expansion and establishment of new sites. The costs and impacts of alternative transportation modes will also be discussed.

PROFESSIONAL GEOLOGIST NAME CHANGE EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1

With the passage of Senate Bill 1914 (Figueroa) in the Fall of 2004, the name for licensed geologists in the State of California changed from Registered Geologist (RG) to Professional Geologist (PG). This change in the law became effective on January 1, 2005. Individual license numbers will remain the same, but all new pocket licenses and wall certificates will state Professional Geologist. Existing wall certificates and pocket licenses are still valid and do not need to be replaced.

The titles Certified Engineering Geologist (CEG) and Certified Hydrogeologist (CHG) are still valid and are not affected by this change. Registered Geophysicists (RGP) did not have their license renamed. 


