

Congratulations to our 2005 SDAG student scholarship recipient.

Jamie Ward is pursuing her Masters of Science degree in Marine Science at the University of San Diego. She hopes to complete her thesis, entitled "Cadmium variation in *Porites lobata* corals on the Kona Coast of Hawaii" in 2006. Jamie received her Bachelor's Degree at Salsbury University in Maryland. She became interested in coral reefs as an undergraduate when she studied abroad at James Cook University, Townsville, Australia, and visited the Great Barrier Reef. The focus of her graduate research has been to understand how metals in coral skeletal aragonite can trace environmental conditions. Coral trace metals have been used as proxies to measure past sea-surface temperature and productivity. Coral cadmium concentrations have been used to reconstruct the history of past El Niño events. However, in order to use coral trace-metal proxies for paleooceanographic reconstructions, it is important to understand the factors that control their variability in modern environments. As a MS student, Jamie has done field work in the coral reefs in Veracruz, Mexico, has taught laboratories for the Marine Science Department, and worked as a science educator at the Stephen Birch Aquarium and Aquatic Adventures.

We look forward to her presentation at a Spring SDAG meeting.

Janet and Gordon Gastil will be at the Holiday Meeting on 21 December to sell and sign their new book "Follow the Sun." This is an intriguing work of historical fiction that takes readers on an epic journey of exploration, danger, and discovery around the world in the time of the Pharoahs, using plausible methods of transportation and navigation.
